The past century, past decade, and past few years have each in their own way seen extraordinary development across the fields of international trade, intellectual property, antitrust, and financial regulation. The changes are beyond technical or incremental, in many cases raising questions about the very policy goals and foundations of these fields and related regulatory regimes. This symposium will focus on what this all means for both private sector actors and government officials, and what new developments might be on the horizon.

Our focus will be on comparing and contrasting how to confront challenges, solve problems, and collaborate in the national interest in such a dynamic environment. The Symposium will explore key lessons learned and offer insights and best practices for the following:

- Regulatory efficiency and efficacy
- Collaboration across government agencies and across different national governments
- Neutral services for private arbitration, mediation, and monitoring in the shadow of public adjudication
- Compliance and oversight at mission speed
- Integrating contrasting values, such as privacy, on the one hand, and tracking further goals such as know-your-customer and anti-money-laundering, on the other
- Governance and decision-making systems that integrate economic and security interests in government or private sector settings
- How to combine human decision making with machine decision making through artificial intelligence and machine learning
- The impact of blockchain on how we transact and how we regulate
- Private litigation to redress public wrongs, such as whistleblower and qui tam
